MULTIDISCIPLINARY STUDIES



Overview & Course List

PROGRAM:

This major is designed for students who want to spread their major studies across courses and departments of their own choosing. To fulfill the major:

- complete 60 credits of upper-division course work
 - 35 of the 60 credits must be in a thematic area (requires Advisor approval)
 - 15 of the 60 credits must come after an approved Multidisciplinary Studies Plan of Study
- at least 50% of the credits used in the major must be earned at WWU
- a min. of two departments must be represented
- students must earn a minimum of C- or better in courses for major (Pass/Fail grades do not apply)
- a min. cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- the required three writing proficiency points may be taken in any department
- up to 10 credits of internship / field experience can count towards the major

Students are limited to no more than 40 upper division credits in any single academic department and are limited to no more than 44 credits taught in business (departments of accounting, decision sciences, finance and marketing, and management).

HELPFUL HINTS

- Many departments remove major restrictions at various times during Phase 1 and Phase 2.
- For History (HIST) and Global Humanities and Religions (GHR) classes, students who have not taken the exact prerequisies for a course but who have taken equivalent courses or three or more HIST or GHR courses are encouraged to contact the instructor to discuss the possibility of gaining access to the course.
