### Other Useful Information

- 63 Recreation Management and Leadership course credits required for major
- 25 support area credits or minor required for RML major
  - Four option areas in Phase I, II and IV: Community, Outdoor, Therapeutic Recreation, Sustainable Tourism
  - 20 maximum credit-load per quarter
  - 18 credits maximum per quarter without additional credit charge
- 180 credits needed to graduate, which includes a minimum of 60 upper-division courses (44 of those are in RML major courses)
