In addition to supporting youth sexual health related projects across ASH, the primary focus of this position provides research and data coordination to the federally funded grant the Personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP). PREP in Oregon currently supports sexual health education and healthy relationship programming to youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This position provides data analysis and interpretation with a racial equity/health equity lens for a variety of audiences.

Leading with race, we work to improve health outcomes for all communities that experience inequities. We provide resources, data and funding to amplify racial equity within our programs throughout the state and prioritize developing meaningful partnerships with diverse community partners. Minimum Qualifications: These qualifications must be visible in your application for consideration.

Bachelor's Degree in any discipline that included six-quarter units in statistics or quantitative analysis methods and procedures, and one year experience using computerized applications to independently gather, compile, and analyze data and prepare narrative or statistical reports.

OR

Four years of research experience using computerized applications to independently gather, compile, and analyze data and prepare narrative or statistical reports.

- Is passionate about promoting youth access to and involvement in health education and health care.

- Has the ability to recommend actions based on research findings.
- Has a strong background in community-based or population-based adolescent health programs.
